What I <u>am</u> saying:

I have considered and prayed about how to lay this out, and I believe that it's best to go broad to narrow.

Broadest category Ankle deep:

Knee Deep:



What is missing from Acts 15 that you might <u>teach</u> to your children? Wives <u>submitting</u> to their husbands? Stealing the <u>tithe</u> from God? Many others.

Acts 15: 21 For the law of Moses has been preached in every city from the earliest times and is read in the synagogues on every Sabbath."

Mt. 5:18-19 18 For truly I tell you, <u>until heaven and earth disappear</u>, not the smallest letter, not the least stroke of a pen, will by any means disappear from the Law until everything is accomplished. 19Therefore anyone who sets aside one of the least of these commands and teaches others accordingly will be called least in the kingdom of heaven, but <u>whoever</u> practices and teaches these commands will be called great in the kingdom of heaven. 20For I tell you that unless your righteousness surpasses that of the Pharisees and the teachers of the law, you will certainly not enter the kingdom of heaven.

Explanation:

Although we are saved by grace alone through faith alone, not all faith is equal. We expect to see fruit. John 15:2 He cuts off every branch in me that bears no fruit, while every branch that does bear fruit he prunes so that it will be even more fruitful.

Faith and works are not mutually exclusive. They work in tandem. There is a new covenant (Heb. 9:15), and the old wineskins are set aside. (Luke 5:39) The new covenant does not abolish the Law of God.

Deep water can also be paralleled with the shape of the temple. Jerusalem -> Holy of Holies. (Isa. 66:18-23)

Objection:

People who hear this and have read the New Testament will say that Paul said that it's not about the Law, about food, about circumcision. My answer is that Paul was telling the Jews who had the Law that they needed Jesus. The rumor was that Paul rejected the law. Acts 21: 21 But they are under the impression that you teach all the Jews who live among the Gentiles to forsake Moses, telling them not to circumcise their children or observe our customs. ... 24 Take these men, purify yourself along with them, and pay their expenses so they can have their heads shaved. Then everyone will know that there is no truth to these rumors about you, but that you also live in obedience to the law.

Final Verse:

Isaiah 2:3 Many peoples will come and say, "Come, let us go up to the mountain of the LORD, to the temple of the God of Jacob. He will teach us his ways, so that we may walk in his paths." The law will go out from Zion, the word of the LORD from Jerusalem.
